Conjunctions

• A conjunction is a word used to connect words, phrases, or clauses.

Coordinating Conjunctions

- Coordinating conjunctions connect words, phrases, or clauses of equal importance.
- Coordinating conjunctions are:
 - and
 - but
 - or
 - so

Subordinating Conjunctions

- Are used to connect a dependent clause to another clause. A dependent clause has a subject and a predicate but cannot stand alone.
- Subordinating conjunctions are:
 - because
 - before, during, when, while
 - although, unless

Correlating Conjunctions

- Correlative conjunctions are sort of like tagteam conjunctions.
- They come in pairs, and you have to use both of them in different places in a sentence to make them work.
- They get their name from the fact that they work together (co-) and relate one sentence element to another.

Correlating Conjunctions

 Correlative conjunctions include pairs like "both/and," "whether/or," "either/or," "neither/nor," "not/but" and "not only/but also."
