- Write about how you decorate your home.

12. Holiday Traditions

- Families have many traditions at holiday time. Some families cook special foods. Others shop for and wrap gifts, decorate the house, and have many other fun times together.
- Write an informative essay to tell your class about some of the things that you like to do with your family during holiday time. Give details and examples to help make your writing more interesting.

17. Kwanzaa and Unity

- Kwanzaa was established by Dr. Maulana Karenga as a holiday of African-American identity and community in 1966.
- Do you think it's important for a group of people to have a collective identity? Why or why not?

18. Kwanzaa and Family Origin

- The holiday of Kwanzaa was established in part so that African-Americans could reconnect with their African roots.
- Do you know where in the world your family is originally from?
- If so, how do you think it has affected the way you've grown up? If not, why might it be important for you to find out?

19. The Seven Principles of Kwanzaa

- Kwanzaa is centered around seven principles, known as the Nguzo Saba.
- Each of the seven days of Kwanzaa corresponds to a different principle: unity, self-determination, collective work and responsibility, cooperative economics, purpose, creativity, and faith.
- Which of these seven principles do you think is the most important and why?

20. Decorating for Kwanzaa

- Households celebrating Kwanzaa decorate their households with colorful African cloths, the colors black, red, and green, and a candle holder with seven candles, called a kinara.
- What is the symbolism behind the way people decorate their homes for Kwanzaa?
- Describe what it might be like to be invited to the house of a friend who celebrates Kwanzaa. What might you enjoy about it and why would you like it?

21. Veteran's Day and Memorial Day in the U.S.

- The United States celebrates our veterans on two separate holidays each year.
- The holidays are Memorial Day in May and Veteran's Day in November.
- Research what the difference is between the two holidays and write an essay on what the differences are.
