Paragraph 2:

- 1) Write about **one character trait** about one revolutionary woman.

 - **TOPIC SENTENCE EXAMPLE:** One character trait that describes Sybil Ludington is that she was brave.
- 3) Use a quote to prove your inference about the character trait.
- 4) Write at least three sentences to explain your quote and the character trait.

- 5) Write about **another character trait** about the one revolutionary woman that you chose to analyze in paragraph 2.
- 6) Use a topic sentence to introduce the character trait at the beginning of paragraph 3.
 - **TOP SENTENCE EXAMPLE:** Another character trait that describes Sybil Ludington is that she is strong.
- 7) Use another quote to prove your inference about the second character trait.
- 8) Write at least three sentences to explain your quote and the character trait.

Paragraph 4:

- 9) Write about **one character trait** about **ANOTHER revolutionary woman**.
- 10) Use a topic sentence to introduce another character trait at the beginning of paragraph 4.
 - **TOPIC SENTENCE EXAMPLE:** Abigail Adams was another revolutionary woman with strong character traits. Abigail Adams was extremely intelligent.
- 11) Use a quote to prove your inference about the character trait.
- 12) Write at least three sentences to explain your quote and the character trait.

Paragraph 5:

- 13) Write about **ANOTHER character trait** about **THE SECOND revolutionary woman** that you chose to analyze.
- 14) Use a topic sentence to introduce the character trait at the beginning of paragraph 5.
 - **TOPIC SENTENCE EXAMPLE:** Another character trait that stands out for Abigail Adams is that she was supportive.
- 15) Use another quote to prove your inference about the second character trait.
- 16) Write at least three sentences to explain your quote and the character trait.

- 18) Describe a character trait that you share with this woman.
- 19) Use a topic sentence to introduce the character trait at the beginning of paragraph 6.
